### **Important Messages**

#### Seesaw

It's great that all families have now connected with Seesaw so that we can share information with you all. A quick reminder that, should you wish to contact us, please either phone the office to speak with Mrs Shatford or myself, email <a href="mailto:admin.sageston@pembrokeshire.gov.uk">admin.sageston@pembrokeshire.gov.uk</a>, speak to me at the gate in the morning or approach your child's class teacher at the end of the school day.

#### **School Uniform and PE**

Please ensure that **all belongings are labelled with your child's name**. We continue to have lots of unclaimed items that are not labelled and, therefore, very difficult to return to their rightful owners. Please can I remind you that, unless staff explicitly state otherwise (through messages on Seesaw), pupils are expected to come to school in their school uniform and change into a PE kit for their PE sessions. Please do not send your child into school in their PE kit at the start of the day if you know they have PE later in the day.

#### Pick Up at the End of the Day

As I have requested in previous newsletters, to make things easier for teachers dismissing all the pupils from their classes at the end of each school day, please could I ask that, as parents, you position yourselves where the class teacher can see you. I appreciate some parents may have children being released from two classes at the same time, and I would ask that, if it is practical to do so, you position yourself centrally on the yard so that both class teachers are able to see you. This will help us to ensure that all pupils are released safely to their adults in a timely manner. A reminder that pupils should be picked up at 3.20pm if they are in Robin and Barn Owl Classes and 3.30pm if they are in Swan and Kingfisher Classes. After school clubs finish at 4.15pm and we would be grateful if pupils are collected promptly if they are attending a club.

In addition, please could I remind you that we need to be notified if there is to be a change to the person collecting your child/ren at the end of the day. If we are at all unsure, we will need to phone you and this unnecessarily delays some pupils and families from leaving the school site.

Finally, please could you ensure that, where you have to wait between 3.20pm and 3.30pm to pick up children because you have younger and older children to collect, your children are supervised at all times. A number of incidences have occurred recently, including children going out of gates towards the road without their parents being aware. If we continue to have concerns about this, then we will need to keep the silver gate at the bottom of the small slope closed in future for everyone's safety. Please can I also ask that, if you see children playing with footballs, netball or rugby balls on the yard at this time, that you ask them to return them to school. There are too many people on the yard during pick up for it to be safe to play ball games.

#### **Behaviour Charter**

School staff have worked to develop a revised approach towards behaviour at the school. The aim of the new Behaviour Charter that we are now using is to try to ensure that behaviour is dealt with consistently. We also hope that all pupils will feel that they have a clearer understanding of what is expected from them on a day-to-day basis. The new charter establishes a range of unacceptable behaviours and the consequences for them. We are confident that it ensures greater equity and fairness for all pupils.

As you know, positive behaviour is encouraged through our House Point system, but we all recognise that there should be consistent consequences where behaviour is not acceptable.

There are two pages to the charter, with pupils in Robin Class working from the first page and all other pupils working from the second page.


#### **Open Evening**

#### **Cross Country**

The pupils were excellently behaved and it was fantastic to see so many children keen to take part. Looking around at the other schools, I am sure we had one of the largest teams at the event. Well done to all of those who took part (and all of the pupils who took part in the qualifying races earlier in the week) for your determination, perseverance and enthusiasm. As well as several pupils finishing in the top twenty of each race, we had three medallists (the top ten in each race were awarded a medal): Elliot in the Year 2 Boys' race, Misha in the Year 4 Boys' race and Evie in the Year 6 Girls' race. A special well done to those three pupils.

We have also celebrated Hello Yellow Day and Diwrnod Shwmae since my last newsletter and this week we had Humanities week where we learnt about Black History Month and various different religions.
